He is the founder of The Music Mission, an International Church Music teaching and advisory service in church music and liturgy. He is a busy composer and has published many songs and anthems for churches and schools. As conductor of the City of Bristol Choir and the Exultate Singers he has a busy concert schedule around Bristol and the South West.
